Minutes of a Committee Meeting held on June 22nd 48

1. There were present
The Chairman, Hon Treasurer, Hon Secretary, C. Low
P. Button, K. Humphreys, D. Parsons, S. Thomson.
2. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed.
3. P. Cahill and A. F. Gould were elected members of the Club. The Hon Sec mentioned that Gould had been a fire-war member, and the committee waived, in his case, the entrance fee.
4. The Hon Treasurer reported a balance in hand of £6.0.
5. The Chairman gave an account of a meeting of the Laving Exhibition Committee.

6. The Hon Secretary read a letter from A. E. Glennie mentioning that the W.C.C. subscription to the C.R.Q. for the current year had not been paid. The matter was referred to the Hon Treasurer.

A. Glennie also asked that the main items of the agenda be divulged to absent committee members.

The meeting considered that it was not practical to do this, as it may lead to certain items being discussed after the subject had been debated and closed. Also, that it would not be in order to discriminate between local members of the committee and those who lived further ~~of~~ afield. The Hon Secretary was

instructed to write to Brig Glennie, giving him the feelings of the committee on the matter.

This led to a discussion of the subject of publicity, and the Chairman mentioned that we may have been wrong in our attitude towards the 'Press'. The Hon Secretary was instructed to give Hacker the information when it was available as it would be good publicity for the Club.

9. The Hon Secretary read a post card from Hywel
Murrell stating that he would be visiting

Laird's Bar and start a dig at Red Quarry.

to the meeting.
